FOR SPRING TERM, 2022
November 1 -10, 2021

We hope you are ready to register for another term at Berea. Please arrange to meet with your advisor between Monday, October 18 and Friday, October 29 to plan your schedule. You should include alternate courses in the event your preferred courses are not available at the time of registration.

COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURES IN THE ORDER GIVEN FOR REGISTRATION:

1. Contact your academic advisor for an appointment to plan your academic program.
2. You are expected to do preliminary planning of your schedule prior to your meeting with your advisor. Also, be prepared to discuss with your advisor your future career plans and how you are currently progressing. Please bring a copy of your degree audit (listed as Degree Evaluation) along with other relevant materials with you to the appointment with your advisor.
3. After your schedule(s) is completed, your advisor will give you an alternate PIN (which is a Personal Identification Number to use for registration only). This PIN is equivalent to the advisor's signature and indicates that the two of you have met and completed the schedule planning process. You will be asked for your Alternate Pin after you go in to the Registration screens. **Please take care not to misplace this important part of your registration information – only your advisor can give it to you again.** The Office of the Registrar will not provide a student with their PIN during the initial registration period.
4. Use your alternate PIN to begin your registration on myBerea according to the schedule below. (You will not be able to register until your scheduled time.) The Web registration screens provide instructions on how to proceed with registration.
5. Please be aware that your labor contract for fall must be completed prior to registration.

ORDER OF REGISTRATION

Registration day and time is determined by the number of credits you have earned (**does not include the credits for which you are currently enrolled**). Please check the menu on myBerea for the section "Check your Registration Status" to view your assigned time for registration. This will also give you access to see if you have any holds that would prevent your registration (Emergency Contact Information Update, Financial Aid, Student Payroll, Student Accounts). Any holds will need to be cleared through the office that placed the hold on your record before you can register.

CLOSED CLASSES, COURSE TIME CONFLICTS, PREREQUISITES

You will not be required to get the signature of your advisor if you encounter closed classes, have a course time conflict, or if you have problems with prerequisites. Instead, please contact the instructor of the course. If you are given permission to enroll in the course, that instructor will process the override and you must then register for the course by going back to the Web Registration page in myBerea.

INTERNSHIP AND INDEPENDENT STUDY

To register for any Internship, you must submit the appropriate application materials with required signatures to the Internship Office. Be sure you are aware of deadlines. The Internship Office will submit a list of the approved internships to the Office of the Registrar (116 Lincoln Hall) for registration processing.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES FOR APPLIED MUSIC (PRIVATE LESSONS)

You will sign up for these courses in the Music Building (Presser Hall) at the beginning of the Fall and Spring terms. The Registrar will register you for these courses once the list of students is complete.

CHANGE OF PROGRAM (DROPPING/ADDING COURSES)

You will be permitted to drop-add, without fee, anytime between the time you register and Monday, January 17, 2022 by Web Registration. After these dates, you are not permitted to add a course. To withdraw from a course, you will need to process an electronic [drop form](#) from the Registrar's Forms Page with your advisor's signature. Any course withdrawals after January 17, 2022 will be assigned a withdrawal grade.

POLICY REGARDING COURSES DROPPED

Courses dropped during official registration periods or the date posted on the [Spring Academic Calendar](#) will not be reflected on the permanent record. The letter "W" (withdrawn) will be used to indicate courses dropped during the time indicated to withdraw from a course with a grade of W on the academic calendar. You may withdraw from a course during the time indicated to receive a WP or WF on the academic calendar and your instructor will be asked to indicate the quality of any completed work to that point with a "WP" (withdrawn passing) or a "WF" (withdrawn failing). No course may be dropped during the final seven weeks of the term. WP/WF will not be counted in calculating the GPA. (See calendar above for official drop/withdrawal dates.)

TEACHER CERTIFICATION

Students planning to complete requirements for teacher certification must follow the guidelines given in "Program for Preparation for Teachers" in the Berea College Catalog.

COURSE FEES

Course fees, shown in the Schedule of Classes and in the current Berea College Catalog, are charged to the student's account. The fee is automatically charged upon registration for the course. The student's account is credited if the course is dropped by the end of the first week of class as indicated in the official College calendar.

SCHEDULE OF CLASS HOURS

Letters following course numbers (A, B, C, etc.) indicate sections of the same course. Letters attached to the course (i.e., 186A) indicate a specialized topic. The time of the class meeting is indicated by CLOCK hours, (e.g., 0800 is 8:00 am, 1000 for 10:00 am, 0100 for 1:00 pm). The days of class meetings are indicated as follows: M=Monday, T=Tuesday, W=Wednesday, R=Thursday, F=Friday, Saturday=ST.

CONVOCATION CREDIT

All students will automatically be enrolled in a .25 credit convocation course (CNV 100) during each of their regular terms of enrollment, with the exception of the final term of enrollment, for a maximum of eight such terms. For each term of enrollment in CNV 100, the student will earn a grade of CA (which is calculated as an A in the GPA) for attending at least seven convocations. The grade of CF (which is calculated as an F in the GPA) will be awarded for attendance at fewer than seven convocations. Enrollment in this course is optional during the final term at Berea and is prohibited if the student has already enrolled in this course eight terms.

IMPORTANT

Course Loads: The Maximum course credit load is 4.5 for all full-time students. Requests for course overloads can be made by the student by completing an [Overload Form](#) which is available on the forms page of the Registrar's webpage. Overloads will be added to the student schedule after the necessary approval signatures are collected electronically.

Underloads: For degree candidates, all class underloads (less than 3 credits) must have prior approval of the Student Admission and Academic Standing Committee. Requests for course underloads should be submitted to the Office of Academic Services (110 Lincoln Hall).

SATISFACTORY ACADEMIC PROGRESS

Students will be placed on Academic Probation at the end of any regular term for failure to maintain a minimum 2.0 cumulative grade point average (GPA) or meet the credits requirement identified in the Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) chart listed in the College Catalog (<http://catalog.berea.edu/Current/Catalog>).

Students who are deficient in meeting the SAP requirements may make up the deficiency during the Summer Term at Berea College or another regionally accredited institution. If credit is to be earned elsewhere, permission must be secured by completing the [Application for Transfer Credit form](#) prior to enrollment.

Spring 2022 Special Topics Course Descriptions

APS 186 PW – Appalachian Ceramics

This course explores the aesthetics, technology, and science involved in the Appalachian tradition of bringing clay from the hills to the table, while guiding students through an examination of the historic and contemporary ceramic makers and cultures in the southern Appalachian Mountain region. A hands-on course, students will be asked to complete a series of projects in support of readings on traditional and contemporary topics on the Appalachian craft tradition. The history of hand-building and wheel-thrown techniques and practical applications will also be examined, as well as local clay prospecting and processing techniques.

APS 386 CG – Community Story Activism

This course is an intensive and immersive study into building and presenting site-responsive and environmentally-engaged public performance through the lens of Ezell: Ballad of a Land Man, an award-winning, professional, outdoor touring performance — a parable of domination and resilience from the foothills of Appalachia. The class will explore how this work is devised and is adapted for local performance and residency at Berea College's Indian Fort Mountain in Spring 2022. Students will have the opportunity to learn and collaborate alongside Lead Artist Bob Martin of Clear Creek Creative along with other professional artists of the Ezell ensemble/creative team including directors, designers, musicians, producers, culinary artists and performers

ARH/PSJ 286 PK: Art and Social Justice

Over the last several years, Art has drawn itself closer and closer to Social Justice: from Occupy Wall Street to the opioid crisis, artists have taken up with activists, and museums are being held accountable in new ways for the makeup of their boards and funding bodies. But is art really equivalent to activism? It certainly has less reach than social media, less confrontational power than public protests, and less authority than established news outlets. Yet, art's distinction from these avenues allows it to provoke deeper thinking and to address change over a longer historical period. This course will look at artists, artworks, and critical debates about the potentials of art to make change.

ARH 486: Anthropological Archaeology Past Present and Future

Divided into three modules, this class serves as the capstone for the independent anthropological archaeology majors. The first part of the class will be an exploration of the history of anthropological archeology. Students will engage with seminal works of key archaeologists as a means to understand the development of archaeological theory and method. Using contemporary material, students will explore the ways in which archaeologists have incorporated a range of theory and method into their research and will expose students to the range of archaeology being practiced today. The preponderance of readings will be by women, black, and indigenous archaeologists. Finally, students will conduct their own anthropological archaeological research culminating in a final paper and formal presentation to the public. While archaeological excavation is not logistically possible, student research may involve analysis of artifact assemblages, review and re-evaluation of other archaeological investigation, or an extensive critical literature review of research on a specific regional/period in their area of interest.

AST/PSC 286 LM – East Asian Politics

This course will examine the inter- and intra-state politics of the East Asian region, focusing specifically on mainland China, Japan, Taiwan, and the Koreas. The first section highlights East Asia as a region, introducing some common themes such as historical memory, cultures, and the process of state building. The second section focuses on the institutional arrangements, political development, and leadership of individual states.

The third section examines the economic development of the region and the roles of states in this process. Finally, students will also examine U.S.-East Asian foreign relations to consider the U.S.'s future role in the region.

CFS/SOC 286 PD – Death and Dying

This course provides an interdisciplinary approach toward learning as students explore a wide-range of topics designed to broaden and deepen their understanding of death and dying. Topics include current and historical cultural attitudes, public policy, financial and legal aspects, end-of-life care, ritual, body disposition, grief, death across the lifespan, suicide, near-death experiences, beliefs, values, and religious teachings about death. This course incorporates a variety of perspectives, including those arising from lifespan human development, sociology, psychology and philosophy. Each student will have opportunities to examine and reflect upon their own personal attitudes, values and behaviors associated with dying and death.

COM 186 – Public Speaking SM

This class will examine the principles of speech writing and delivery for various public settings and occasions.

CSC 386 JC – Text Analysis and Cultural Exploration

A dive into the many different ways that computer science technology can be used to process text to answer deeper questions about the relationship between people and places in a community or organization. Students will explore many different tools available as parts of a system they will design and build that analyze literary text and archive repositories to answer these questions.

CSC 486 PS – Network Dynamics of Social Behavior

This course will examine the dynamics of social networks. Students will engage with network models representing social environments and implement and explore experimental contexts in the areas of voting theory, opinion diffusion, and epidemiology. The class will develop the theory surrounding various network features such as centrality and self-sorting. This course counts in the foundations area of the Computer and Information Science major.

EDS 186 HB – Inquiry into Social Studies Essentials

EDS 286 PW – Contemplative Pedagogy

This interdisciplinary course will use the medium of contemplative pedagogy and mindfulness practices to address issues of educational access as related to racial inequality and poverty in the United States k-12 public school system. Studying and discussing issues of race, poverty and inequity can create strong feelings and lead to divisiveness, hard feelings and/or anger at best and violence at worst. Currently, the concern about the breakdown of civil discourse in our society is alarming and real. More specifically, much has been written about the ongoing and persistent issue of lack of civil discourse on college campuses. In this proposed course, students will be introduced to the field of contemplative pedagogy and mindfulness practices as another suite of tools to deepen their civil discourse skills. Then students will apply these practices to their study and analysis of educational inequity, racial inequality and poverty through a service-learning project involving K-12 students.

GEO 386 SB – Petrology

Petrology is the study of rock formation. This course will focus on both igneous petrology and metamorphic petrology. The igneous petrology portion will delve into the processes that govern mineral crystallization from lava/magma. Topics will include radioactivity and isotopic analysis,

basic thermodynamics, phase diagrams, and rock identification/classification. The metamorphic portion will delve into the process that govern solid-state phase changes between minerals as a function of pressure and temperature. Topics will include metamorphic grades/facies, geothermometers and geobarometers, and rock identification/classification.

HHP 286 MTA – Ultimate Taskmaster

The Online Physical Education Nexus (OPEN) Taskmaster course focuses on elementary to adult activities with a focus on the six health-related skills of fitness (agility, balance, coordination, power, speed and reaction time). Students will participate in assessments and weekly activities such as Pilates, aerobics, core workouts, line dances, and ladder drills which correlate to these skills. The Taskmaster portion encompasses the intellectual and physical dimensions of wellness by encouraging students to think creatively and laterally in game-like challenges that can be completed with common household items. Students will also develop tasks for others using common household items.

HIS 186 JG – Reacting to the Past

In many classes students learn by receiving ideas and information from instructors and texts, or they discuss such materials in seminars. This course will be different. Class sessions will consist of elaborate games, set in the past, in which students are assigned roles informed by classic texts in the history of ideas. Students themselves, acting in character, will run class meetings, organize the daily schedule, assign each other tasks, and determine the strategy and tactics for their various factions. By inhabiting historical roles for weeks at a time, students will master skills—speaking, writing, critical thinking, problem solving, leadership, and teamwork—needed to prevail in difficult and complicated situations. We will play three long-form games during the semester, each of which offers a new way of exploring key turning points in American history. The first will be set in the wake of a fiery religious trial in Puritan New England. The second unfolds on the eve of the American Revolution in New York City, where patriots and loyalists, freemen and slaves, choose sides for the fight ahead. The third takes place in Greenwich Village, New York in 1913 as suffragists, labor union members, and a motley crew of bohemians meet in a basement restaurant to debate their vastly different plans for political participation and self-discovery in a rapidly industrializing nation.

HIS 186 RB – Global History Since 1450

This class explores global history through two themes: local lives and the development of the state. We interrogate the new forms of power which sought to reshape global connections in the period from c. 1450 and explore the ways in which polities and societies in Asia, Africa and Latin America engaged with and resisted the rise of European power and produced alternatives that both deepened and challenged global engagement

HIS 186 MP – Medieval Animals

This course examines the role of animals and the natural world in medieval European culture, answering questions all the way from “did people in the Middle Ages have pets?” to “how did constructions of the animal/human divide relate to the persecution of marginalized groups?”. In addition to discussing the day-to-day relationships between humans and animals, from hunting dogs to livestock, this course investigates the many spaces in between ‘animal’ and ‘human’, from feral children and werewolves to animal allegories and the monsters on the edges of maps. Our investigations will draw from medieval philosophy and theology, law and literature, as well as everyday life on a medieval farm, ultimately asking the question “what makes us human?”

HIS 286 MP – Medieval Justice

How did people in the Middle Ages define crime? What about sin? This course explores how communities in medieval Europe defined and

responded to deviant behavior. From the personality of the law in early 'barbarian kingdoms' through the rediscovery of Roman law and codification of canon law, students will have the opportunity to explore the intricacies and contradictions of overlapping medieval legal systems that were, in the words of James Brundage, "all nestled cheek by jowl with each other". Through examining legal culture, both through law codes and records of practice, students will gain a better understanding of medieval culture, including, but not limited to, ideas about gender, sexuality, religious difference, social class, state power vs. local custom, and religious vs. secular authority. Particularly important will be the themes of honor and shame, feud and reconciliation, as well as the many forms of medieval confession in sacred and secular contexts.

HIS 286 MP2 – Medieval Travel

This course examines the movement of people, goods, and ideas in the Middle Ages, both within Europe and to/from the rest of the world. In addition to travel narratives that pushed the boundaries of the 'known world,' such as Marco Polo and Ibn Battuta, this class examines religious pilgrimages, both penitential and voluntary, as well as established trade routes, from the Silk Road to the Hanseatic League. Not all journeys were physical: holy men and women made otherworldly mystical journeys and ghostly visitors warned of the horrors of purgatory. While some journeys were enriching, bringing scientific, medical, and technological advancements to Europe, others were destructive, such as the military expeditions of the Crusades. Though globalization is a buzzword of the modern world, connections and exchange enriched medieval society as well.

HIS/AFR 386 JK – Black Power Beyond Borders

Where, when, and what was the civil rights movement? What were its goals, and who deserves credit for its successes and failures? This course will expand the traditional narrative of the American Civil Rights Movement geographically, temporally, and in terms of the actors involved. We will debate the current understanding of the Civil Rights Movement as (1) both efforts in the United States and social and political struggles that inspired and were inspired by the Black Freedom Struggle in other parts of the world, (2) the relationship between events in the 1950s and 1960s with events both earlier and later, (3) how grassroots struggle of countless individuals related to the perceptions of leaders within representative movements. We will probe how to best understand the movement of ideas and actions across time, social movements, and national borders. Topics will include the transnational dimensions of anti-slavery movements, white supremacy, and Pan-Africanism; Marcus Garvey's UNIA; the influence of Gandhian nonviolent civil disobedience on the Black freedom struggle; African American responses to the Italian invasion of Ethiopia; the racial dimensions of the First and Second World Wars; African American engagement with decolonization in Africa and revolutionary change in China, Cuba, Vietnam and elsewhere; and the global legacy of Black Power.

REL 286 TS – Viking Age Norse Religion

The peoples of Scandinavia, collectively known as the Norse and the Vikings in history, provide a remarkable and complex culture for historical and religious studies. Our course will seek to develop a picture of the history, culture, and society of the peoples of Denmark, Norway, and Sweden with specific focus on the pre-Christian religious traditions and mythology of the Viking Age, the 8th-12th centuries of the European Middle Ages.

THR 286 GG – Screenwriting

Screenwriting and the development of film scripts is one of the key elements to fiction film. Through both theoretical discussions and hands on scriptwriting workshops, students will delve into the art and craft of screenwriting. During the course of this term, students will explore of the process of developing and writing original screenplays, which will include: creating and developing characters; developing the story of the

screenplay from premise through to finished script via developing plot points and narrative structure; creating and plotting story and character arcs; learning and employing the precise form for a screenplay; writing and revising drafts, and creating loglines, a film treatment, and a pitch for their script. Further, in the class students will be introduced to different models for both conventional and unconventional screenplays.

WGS 286 SF – Feminist & Queer Dis/Ability Studies

In this interdisciplinary course, we begin with the framework of feminist disability theory in order to understand and critically engage with how an abelist society categorizes some “bodyminds” as “less than,” “unruly,” “mad,” and/or “disposable.” We will use intersectional theory to aid in our exploration of and decolonization of dis/ability as a socially constructed, corporeal, lived experience that is also gendered, raced, classed, etc with a specific colonial, imperialist history. We may engage with the following questions: how do categories of dis/ability attach to specific bodies, experiences, differently in order to make them more legible to the state? How does dis/ability define worthiness, personhood, or citizenship in society? How do historical and contemporary understandings of dis/ability uphold white supremacy, further colonialism, and maintain a cisheteropatriarchal hierarchy? How does dis/ability expand or complicate experiences of sexuality, gender, desire, and attraction? Where do issues of dis/ability and labor intersect?

Spring 2022 Art/Art History Topics Course Descriptions

ART 200D: Figure Drawing

Introductory study of the human figure with emphasis on structure and proportion, volumetric form, gesture, and the integration of a figure into an environment. ART 200D, Figure Drawing, will work from nude and clothed models. Media may include graphite, charcoal, ink, conté, and pastels.

ART 200P: Printing Nature

This special topic course will investigate the natural world through printmaking. Utilizing a mixture of studio and on-site art making; projects will explore themes of beauty, the sublime, the mundane, cycles and others. Artworks will investigate these themes through representation, abstraction, and non-representation through various printmaking processes. No prior printmaking or visual arts experience needed. This course fulfills the Arts Perspective.

Spring 2022 English Topics Course Descriptions

ENG 205/305 (Hawthorne): No Time for Tears: Friendship Between Black and White Women. In this course, we will explore the fraught socio-political history of Black women’s relationships with White women in African American literature and history. From Harriet Jacob’s sexual terrorism and subjection, enabled by her mistress, Mrs. Flint, to Ida B. Wells’s refusal to kowtow to Frances E. Willard and her racist exclusion of Black women’s suffrage, to Zora Neale Hurston’s infamous relationship with her patron, Charlotte Osgood Mason, White women have demonstrated a shockingly violent self-interest. Black academics like Stephanie Jones-Rogers, Tera Hunter, Hazel Carby, Audre Lorde, Angela Davis, and Britney Cooper have explored the myriad ways White women have aided and abetted racism and White supremacy when it comes to Black women. More recently, Black feminist writers like Morgan Jenkins and Mikki Kendall warn about the perils of building coalitions with White women. Creative bonds between Black and White women are rare, if not altogether absent. In this course, we will be interested in exploring if

relationships can develop on equal footing, relationships can be unfettered by trappings of quid pro quo transactions. Relationships that might be built upon hard emotional labor, trust, and—risky and rare as it may seem—love? Are these relationships even possible? Might we explore this deficit? We seek to interrogate with brutal honesty the stakes that underwrite Black women's relationships with White women. Readings may include: Stephanie Jones-Rogers's *They Were Her Property: White Women as Slave Owners in the American South*, Alice Walker's *In Search of Our Mothers Gardens*, Toni Morrison's *The Bluest Eye*, Brittney Cooper's *Eloquent Rage*, Liz Tigelaar's *Little Fires Everywhere*, Harriet Jacobs's *Incidents in the Life of a Slave Girl*.

ENG 210 (Cohen): Reformation and Revolution. This course surveys major authors in the literature and culture of the Reformation and Counter-Reformation alongside the parallel impact of the print revolution in moveable type. We ask how those twin revolutions shaped culture and track the rise of the book as a key object in European religious and material culture. The print revolution and the Reformation stand at the opposing axes of religious and cultural forms of social change and mobility that contributed to the emergence of recognizably modern forms of subjectivity, the growth of national identities alongside international law and commerce, the rise of scientific culture, and competing views of community belonging and world-making. The course is ultimately driven by central questions including how these twin revolutions generated lasting changes in belief and literate culture, the effects of which we continue to experience today.

ENG 225 (Crachiolo): Queering the Epic. In Western literature, epic is arguably the most masculine of genres; it's full of heroes and quests and great deeds. There is, apparently, little room for other genders or for queerness. Or is there? This course aims to reconsider genders, gender expressions, and masculinities in Western epic. Beginning with Homer's *Odyssey*, we're going to explore the big hits of literary epic alongside reimaginings of them in literature and film. Later in the semester, we'll branch out to some lesser known Western epics and non-Western epics as well.

ENG 240 (Montgomery): Climate Change and American Fiction. This course provides an introduction to contemporary artistic responses to climate change as well as the emerging literary genre of "climate change fiction" (or cli-fi). By studying the ways in which literature, film, and music represent the natural world in the age of global warming we will examine how imaginative texts can suggest new ways of thinking about climate change, our relationship to the environment, and possible futures. Possible authors include Jesmyn Ward, Jeff Vandermeer, Joy Williams, and Denise Giardina.

ENG 240 (Bruder): Literary Feasts. The food that we eat can tell fascinating stories about who we are. Likewise, the stories we tell about ourselves are often rich in images of food and eating. In this course, we will investigate "books that cook": novels that imagine characters devouring plates of steaming meats in feasts of excess; poems about cosmopolitan ingredients that span the corners of the globe; memoirs about conflicted identities and ethnic food ways; movies that relish sensual food montages and make viewers practically taste the fare. We will theorize creation and consumption and what it means to interpret cookbooks and recipes today and in the past. By foregrounding gender, race, class, and ethnicity, we will consider how identity shapes our tastes and our eating habits. We will, of course, make our learning manifest in cooking and eating together regularly.

ENG 280 (Gift): Writing the Environment. Students in this course will practice translating scientific papers into news articles, essays, and other forms of writing for the public. We will begin by reading scientific journal articles, and learn how to reduce jargon and increase accessibility to a wide array of audiences, ultimately helping spread scientific literacy and interest in environmental science as a subject.
