

Memorial Funds

The James Watt Raine Memorial Fund

Established in memory of Dr. Raine who was chair of the department of English and Theatre from 1906-1939, this fund was created in 1987. He loved theatre and was a master of teaching and writing. Dr. Raine directed and produced literally hundreds of plays in the old Tabernacle, the college building which stood on the site of the current Jelkyl Drama Center.

The Athur Flandreau Memorial Drama Fund

The Arthur Flandreau Memorial Drama Fund was created in 1980 in memory of Arthur Flandreau, Associate Professor of Library Sciences and Head Librarian of the Hutchins Library from 1974 – 1979. Alfred and Jean Perrin, distinguished friends of the Library, the Theatre Laboratory, and Appalachian Center, established the Fund.

The Arronson Theatre Lectureship

The Arronson Theatre Lectureship program was conceived in 1987 and fully funded in 1989. The initial gift came from the Arronson Foundation, established by Mrs. Gertrude Arronson in 1957. The Arronson Foundation required that its gift be matched by Berea College and this was assisted through a bequest from the estate of the American playwright and author Thornton Wilder.

Paul Power Scholarship

Established to honor the late Paul Power who, for twenty-one years was a vital part of the drama program at Berea College, this scholarship is awarded annually to students to study or work in the area of theatre. "Mr. P" will be remembered for his Summer Repertory Theater, giving the town and surrounding area five shows each week, as well as the Henrietta Child Children's Theater which played to thousands of children each Sunday evening during the summer. He taught drama, speech and humanities, directed many productions at the old Tab, and helped to plan the new Jelkyl drama building.

Who is Who?

Berea College Theatre (*Producer*) is in its 129th season of providing theatre performances and opportunities for the campus. The Theatre major and production program at Berea College has been a critical element to the academic and co-curricular lives of students, colleagues, and our community.

India Allar (Nicky Stamats) is a junior from Mt. Vernon, Ohio, pursuing double majors in theatre and philosophy. India was last seen in One Third of a Nation last semester and is a choreographer for Kinetic Expressions 2022.

Her films have screened internationally as widely as Germany, Greece, cyprus, and the UK; and as close to home as the Louisville International Festival of Film and the Berea College Planetarium. Leslie Bell (Shadow Ensemble) is a sophomore theatre major from Birmingham, Alabama. Leslie is making his theatre debut in The Aleph Complex.

Kaitlin Bowling (Assistant Director) is a freshman theatre and psychology double major from Cynthiana. Kaitlin was an assistant stage manager for Noises Off! Kaitlin was also active with the Red Hen Theatre Company, the Actors Playhouse, and Rohs Theater prior

to attending Berea College.

Lily Burr (Hair & Makeup Design) is a sophomore from southern West Virginia majoring in theatre. She worked as a stagehand in Past Time and played Wilma in The Story About the Tattoo. Lily worked on Hair & Makeup for Noises Off!

Melody Cornwell (Assistant Stage Manager) is a junior pursuing a major in theatre and a minor in business administration. Originally from Cookeville, Tennessee, this is Melody's debut in theatre on the Mainstage.

Alexis Erwin (Understudy for Nicky & Shadow Ensemble) is a junior majoring in engineering technology and applied design from Louisa. Alexis was an understudy in Noises Off! last semester.

In January of 2021, like many students, I was struggling through classes from my apartment bedroom, fearing for the health of myself and those I love and planning for future opportunities I wasn't sure I'd ever get to see. As I sifted through play after play, hoping to find the right one to direct the following year, I met Nicky; a girl plagued by her anxieties too big for her to hold on her own, Naomi; a mother trapped inside her home when the outside world was too much for her to bear, and Border's Guy; a friend with a world of possibilities but no one to push him to see himself in them.

I found the fear, loneliness, grief, and most of all, love that has held all of us together for the last two years in a funny, magical package. These characters have helped me realize that perhaps we're not all as alone as we feel, and I hope you find a home in them too.
